Dear Assembly Member Aguiar-Curry:

Disability Rights California, a non-profit advocacy organization that advances and protects the rights of Californians with disabilities, supports AB 1505.

AB 1505 is attempting to override the *Palmer* (2009)ⁱ decision that struck down an affordable housing mandate in the City of Los Angeles. That decision had statewide implications and made it impossible for local governments to impose ordinances requiring new construction of rental units to include a certain percentage for moderate to low-income tenants. Inclusionary mandates are critical to addressing the current affordable housing crisis in California. Government funding is currently inadequate to meet the demand for affordable housing and an important option is to allow local governments to require development of affordable housing from private developers.

Affordable housing is an issue that requires attention at every level and AB 1505 is addressing this need by re-enabling local governments to pass ordinances for affordable rental units. For these reasons, we support this bill. Please contact me if you have any questions about our position.
