RE: AB 1547 (QUIRK-SILVA) as amended May 1, 2018 – SUPPORT

Dear Senator Hill:

Disability Rights California (DRC), a non-profit advocacy organization that advances and protects the rights of Californians with disabilities, **supports AB 1547.** This bill is scheduled for hearing in the Senate Business, Professions and Economic Development Committee on June 25, 2018.

Existing law establishes the Capital Access Loan Program. The Capital Access Loan Program includes the Small Business Capital Access Loan Program (ADA Program) to assist small businesses in financing the costs of projects that alter or retrofit existing small business facilities to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

Among its many provisions, AB 1547 makes changes to the ADA Program to improve participation and better target the specific kinds of small businesses intended to benefit from the program. The measure expands the definition of "small business" from 15 or fewer full-time employees or that has less than \$5,000,000 in total gross annual income from all sources, to a business with 30 or fewer full-time employees or that has less than \$5,000,000 in total gross annual income from all sources. Thus, it expands the types of businesses that qualify for funding under the ADA Program. AB 1547 (QUIRK-SILVA) as amended May 1, 2018 – SUPPORT Page 2 of 2

DRC supports AB 1547 because the change in the definition of the small business size for purposes of loan eligibility advances disability access compliance. It is a proactive measure that provides resources and incentives to more businesses to comply with the law and promotes equal access for individuals with disabilities. As such, this bill is a step in the right direction and helps to protect the civil rights of individuals with disabilities.
