RE: AB 2022 (CHU) as amended June 21, 2018 - SUPPORT

Dear Senator Portantino:

Disability Rights California (DRC), a non-profit advocacy organization that advances and protects the rights of Californians with disabilities, **supports AB 2022.** This bill is scheduled for hearing in the Senate Appropriations Committee on August 6, 2018.

This bill would require a school or county office of education and a charter school to notify pupils and parents or guardians of pupils no less than twice during the school year how to initiate access to available pupil mental health services on campus or in the community, or both.

Untreated mental illness increases a person's risk for suicide, involuntary emergency care, homelessness, poor clinical outcomes and early death. Clinical research demonstrates that 50 percent of all mental illness begins by the age of 14, and 75 percent by the age of 24. Thus, it is critical to identify and treat youth for mental health illnesses and one of the best places to do that is in the schools.
