RE: AB 2161 (CHIU) - SUPPORT

Dear Assembly Member Chiu:

Disability Rights California (DRC), a non-profit advocacy organization that advances and protects the rights of Californians with disabilities, **supports AB 2161.** This bill is scheduled for hearing in the Assembly Housing and Community Development Committee on March 21, 2018.

This bill establishes a database to compile and centralize data from state and local agencies on California's homeless population and the services they may use. Importantly, this bill recognizes the importance of compiling data regarding those individuals that are homeless and have a disability so that services and housing may be better targeted to their needs.

It is essential that during this housing crisis and increased homelessness evidence-based strategies be employed to target the needs and electiveness of programs and services, including the creation of additional housing and services. Currently there are different well-intentioned state and local strategies being proposed and employed but miss the mark because there is a lack of data and information to better inform the policy and strategies. A reliable state database will significantly assist new strategies.
