RE: AB 2430 (ARAMBULA) – SPONSOR AND SUPPORT

Dear Assembly Member Wood:

Disability Rights California (DRC), a non-profit advocacy organization that advances and protects the rights of Californians with disabilities, **sponsors and supports AB 2430.** This bill is scheduled for hearing in the Assembly Health Committee on April 3, 2018.

AB 2430 corrects a disparity in eligibility levels for Medi-Cal recipients who receive coverage through the Aged and Disabled program (A&D) when compared to eligibility for most other adults. When A&D was established, in 1989, the eligibility level was equivalent to the 133% federal poverty level (FPL) standard. The amount was expressed as a dollar amount, not as a percentage and has not changed.

After ACA implementation, most adults became eligible for Medi-Cal without a share of cost at 138% FPL. The corresponding eligibility level for the A&D program, over time, has decreased to 123% FPL. The result is some seniors and people with disabilities will not be able to have health care without paying approximately \$600 to the share of cost requirement. This inequity should be corrected.

For these reasons, DRC is proud to sponsor and support this bill. Please
