RE: AB 279 (HOLDEN) - SUPPORT

Dear Senator Wiener:

Disability Rights California, a non-profit advocacy organization that advances and protects the rights of Californians with disabilities, supports AB 279. This bill is scheduled for hearing in the Senate Human Services Committee on June 27, 2017.

AB 279 extends authority to the Department of Developmental Services (DDS) and regional centers to adjust the rates of providers to comply with legally binding minimum wage levels enacted in the local jurisdictions where they employ workers to meet consumer service needs under the Lanterman Act. Without an increase to reimbursement rates to meet mandates, many service providers may shut their doors, resulting in a shortage of community based services and supports.

Disability Rights California has been a strong supporter of ensuring wage equity the DDS system. Adjusting rates to meet the requirements of local mandates will strengthen the community based system which is now the safety net for consumers. For these reasons, we support this bill.
