Regional center services and supports are directed towards the "alleviation of a developmental disability," the "social, personal, physical, or economic" habilitation/rehabilitation, or the "achievement and maintenance of independent, productive, and normal lives", which <u>may</u> include services and supports listed in <u>Cal. Welf. & Inst.</u> <u>Code Sec. 4512(b)</u>. **This list <u>IS NOT</u> an exhaustive list.** Remember regional center is payer of last resort and requires use of generic resources whenever possible. See <u>Cal. Welf. & Inst. Code Sec. 4659.10 & 4644(b)</u>.
