RE: SB 283 (WILK) – SUPPORT

Dear Senator Lara:

Disability Rights California (DRC), a non-profit advocacy organization that advances and protects the rights of Californians with disabilities, supports SB 283.

Currently, regional center services are unavailable if a person develops a developmental disability, after the age of 18 in California. Regional centers specialize in providing community-based services that enable individuals with developmental disabilities to achieve their full potential and highest level of self-sufficiency.

SB 283 modifies the definition of developmental disability to a disability that originates before an individual attains 22 years of age, continues, or can be expected to continue, indefinitely, and constitutes a substantial disability for the individual. The definition change would enable a person who acquires a developmental disability before he or she attains 22 years of age to be eligible for regional center services and supports. This change in law would make a huge difference for this group of individuals, who are currently not eligible, because it ensures that they receive needed community-based services from regional centers to be able to live their lives to the fullest.
