RE: SB 565 (PORTANTINO) – SUPPORT

Dear Senator Portantino:

Disability Rights California (DRC), a non-profit advocacy organization that advances and protects the rights of Californians with disabilities, supports SB 565. This bill is scheduled for hearing in the Senate Health Committee on March 29, 2017.

Under existing law, before a person may be certified for a 14 day intensive treatment program, the person is entitled to a certification review hearing conducted by a court appointed commissioner or referee, or a certification review hearing officer. Existing law requires the mental health facility to make reasonable attempts to notify family members or any other person designated by the patient of the time and place of the certification hearing, unless the patient requests that this information not be provided.

This bill would require the mental health facility to make reasonable attempts to notify family members or any other person designated by the patient at least 36 hours prior to the certification review hearing.

By providing a time period for notification of a hearing, if the patient wants others notified of a hearing, it ensures the person notified can arrange to be at the hearing. Since the person receiving notice may be important to the patient to attend, this bill makes sure they will know about the hearing. SB 565 (PORTANTINO) – SUPPORT Page 2 of 2
