RE: SB 759 (MCGUIRE) as amended July 3, 2018 – SUPPORT

Dear Assembly Member Gonzalez Fletcher:

Disability Rights California (DRC), a non-profit advocacy organization that advances and protects the rights of Californians with disabilities, **supports SB 759**. This bill will soon come before you for hearing in the Assembly Appropriations Committee.

Existing law requires an elections official, upon receipt of a vote by mail ballot, to compare the signature on the identification envelope with either the signature appearing on the voter's affidavit of registration or the signature appearing on a form issued by an elections official that contains the voter's signature that is part of the voter's registration record. If the elections official determines that the signatures do not compare, the ballot shall not be counted.

SB 759 eliminates the prohibition on counting the ballot and instead requires the elections official to offer the voter an opportunity to verify his or her signature before certification of the election.

Signatures can change over time. There is a variety of reasons a person with a disability may have a different signature throughout the day. For example, the person may be tired or have physical limitations/challenges

that affect the way that they sign their name at a given time. Additionally, the angle or surface may affect their signature, causing it not to match the one on file. This bill helps to ensure that people with disabilities can have their vote counted and their voices heard by allowing them to verify their signature before election certification.
