RE: SB 798 (HILL) – OPPOSE UNLESS AMENDED

Dear Assembly Member Low:

Disability Rights California (DRC), a non-profit advocacy organization that advances and protects the rights of Californians with disabilities, opposes SB 798 unless amended.

We are opposed to Section 66 of SB 798, which authorizes the Medical Board of California to obtain patient psychiatric records without any authorization from the patient or a court. The psychotherapist patient privilege is contained within Evidence Code Section 1014. This section of the Evidence Code applies to confidentiality of patient information. Unless the patient consents to disclosure of the information, it may not be disclosed, with limited exceptions. The more circumstances where there are exceptions to confidentiality, the less patients will trust their therapists, and the less effective or meaningful therapy will be. We respectfully request Section 66 be stricken from the bill.

For these reasons, we oppose this bill unless amended. Please contact me if you have any questions about our position on this bill.
